Home School Link Workers

If your child has recently started having a difficult time at school, then someone there may talk to you about the school's WHP Link Worker.

Our Home School Link Workers support families across the Wyre Forest and Hagley area with things like:

- Improving attendance
- Avoiding a first exclusion
- Emotional troubles
- Family difficulties
- Debt and money worries
- Bereavement
- and much more



We work closely with parents, schools and other services to support children by deciding together how we can make things better at school or at home so that they can make the most of each school day.

What else do they do ?

You will also see your Link Worker out and about from time to time at your child's school, chatting with parents and staff.

This might be at a Parents Evening, a drop-in like a coffee morning, Sports Day or at the school gates at the beginning or the end of the school day.

Next time you see them, come over and say hello.
